VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Music Therapy – Volunteers interview family and other important contacts of the patient's and learn of the Patient's musical interests. Once established, the Volunteer works to find ways to implement the patient's therapeutic musical desires. This can be played music via a device or perhaps softly playing an instrument.

Pet Therapy – Volunteers with service animals are encouraged to schedule and visit our patients and families who express this common interest.

Friendship Visits – These Volunteers help our patients experience the humanity of their trials. They are simply people helping people which says it all.

Errand Visits – Some Volunteers assist our patient families in allowing these Caregivers a break from the stresses in the home, running out on much-needed errands such as shopping and other needs. We see that at times, Caregivers themselves have medical appointments that they need to attend to, and these Errand Visits can mean a world of difference for these families in crisis.

Activity/Craft Volunteers – These Volunteers have skills that inspire our Hospice patients, getting their minds thinking on things that they used to enjoy and off the sometimes-daunting medical news of the day.

Facility Volunteers – These Volunteers are normally, but not necessarily, some of our male volunteers who may not desire to sit and talk as much – they are able to do a small project around the house that help our patient families "keep their chins up' as they say, serving each other in real and tangible, material ways.

Sitting Vigil (*non-spiritual*) – Humanity is touched by sharing our lives. These Volunteers see their role in simply being there for one-another. They make a difference.

Spiritual Care Volunteers (SCV) – In the waning hours of our Patient's fight, sometimes they can fear being alone. They desire someone to 'be-there' with them and to offer prayers over them in their darkest hours. These Volunteers are Angel's Unaware.
